

1. Repeat after me!

Sit in a circle with the children and start by saying a word out loud. The child on your left should say the word and add their own word. The next child should repeat both words and add a third. Going around the circle, each child should try to repeat the list of words and add their own. Go as long as you can!

You can use the current week's picture cards to help the children both remember and come up with words.

2. Simon says

Form a line with the children. They will walk around the classroom (or yard!) while you call out movements such as "jump on one foot" or "walk on your heels". The catch of the game is that the children should only do the movements when you say "Simon says" first. Those that move at the wrong time or fail to move at the right time join you and can call out their own movements.

"Simon says walk backwards!" = Everyone should walk backwards.

"Jump on one foot!" = Nobody should jump.
